Parksville and District Rock and Gem Club (PDRGC)

History:

The club was originally formed as the "69's Club of Coombs". In May 1984 it assumed its current name and was welcomed as a member of the provincial BCLS.

Objectives:

- To promote and encourage the study, collecting, cutting, polishing and engraving of gemstones, minerals, rocks and other geological materials as a hobby
- To encourage exploration of Vancouver Island for rocks and minerals
- To promote and encourage association and information exchange with other hobbyists
- To sponsor and support activities that aid in sharing knowledge and expertise about all aspects of this hobby

Members:

Members vary in knowledge and experience, but everyone shares an interest in rocks, minerals, gems and lapidary. Experienced members share their knowledge, and beginners are encouraged to ask questions and attend demonstrations as well as participate in workshops and field trips.

Programs:

Talks and demonstrations:

Presentations are given at the meetings by specialists in the field. Topics include lapidary techniques, jewellery-making, accounts from field trips and other related activities.

Time is also allotted for members to give a "show-and-tell" of their latest finds or creations.

Fieldtrips:

A wagonmaster organizes field trips based on membership interest and level of mobility. The goal is to have at least six field trips each year. A liability waiver must be signed for each trip.

Workshops:

In addition to the monthly meetings the club offers occasional workshops to learn new skills or improve existing ones. These depend on availability of instructors and membership interest.

Pebble Pups:

Junior members have opportunities to do a variety of rock related activities in age-specific programs.

Lapidary Shop/Clubhouse:

The Club rents a stand alone building that contains a full complement of lapidary equipment for use by members that have been trained by knowledgeable members. Space also is available for small group classes of topics organized by members.

Shows:

During the year various Rock and Gem Shows are held throughout the province. Members may participate in these shows to promote and sell their own products. The club creates at least one showcase to be featured at all Vancouver Island Shows.

Our Club currently host one fund-raising Show annually. Member support is very much appreciated for these events.
